Justice Mondlane is a Mozambican national, born on August 31, 1955. He is an Associate member of the Centre for African Studies of Eduardo Mondlane University

Justice Luís Mondlane is a judge of the Supreme Court of Mozambique since 18 December 1988. The SADC Summit of Head of States or Governments held from 17 to 18 August 2006, in Gaborone, Botswana in commemoration of the SADC Silver Jubilee, appointed Justice Mondlane as judge of the SADC Tribunal and he was sworn in as its President at the inauguration ceremony and swearing in of the members of the SADC Tribunal.

His areas of key focus have included Constitutional Law, Criminal and Procedural Law and Human Rights Law. His professional experience comprises, among others things: drafting and harmonizing legislation before submitted to the Council of Ministers for approval as well as to the National Assembly. In addition he also has been involved in the process of delivering justice, as well as lecturing at Law School, Eduardo Mondlane University and training programmes (induction courses) for judges, public prosecutors and justice officials.

He has written papers, including, "Access to justice and alternative dispute resolution"; and " Nurturing Justice from Liberated Zones to a Stable Democratic State". He holds a BA (Bacharel at law) from, the Law School at University Eduardo Mondlane, awarded in 1977 and a Law degree (Licenciado) at the same Law School, 1981. Justice Mondlane is a Law Lecturer at in Penal Procedural Law since 1993.

He reads, writes and speaks several languages including Tsonga, Shangane, Portuguese English, French and German.
